"Unleash the Possibilities" Capital Campaign Giving Suggestions

The size of commitments that will be necessary for the "Unleash the Possibilities" Capital Campaign will require thoughtful consideration and careful planning. Several ways of giving are suggested to aid donors in finalizing their decisions.

Budgeted Gifts – When making a substantial gift, it is often helpful to budget one's gift over a period of time. The Campaign Steering Committee has adopted a three-year payment period as a suggested standard for pledges. Payments may be made annually, semi-annually, quarterly or any other way that best meets a donors needs.

Gifts of Appreciated Securities – Of all the methods for making significant gifts, perhaps the most advantageous way of giving is appreciated securities. When giving such securities or bonds, the donor must transfer these directly to the Indiana County Humane Society. In doing so, it enables the donor to make a significant gift while at the same time, taking advantage of allowable tax savings.

Gifts of Appreciated Property – Transferring real estate or tangible personal property, worth more than the original purchase price, is another way to make substantial contributions. Such gifts can also produce tax savings for the donor.

Matching Gifts – Many corporations have matching gift plans for their retired employees. Matching gifts can often double or even triple one's gift to the Indiana County Humane Socity. Please check with your employer's human resource office to see if they will match your gift. Donors using matching gifts will receive credit for both their personal gift and the matching gift.

No one person or group can meet the challenge facing us. Only together, as we share our resources and dreams, can we meet our goals.

As you consider your part in the "Unleash the Possibilities" Capital Campaign, consider the following:

- Pledge payments may be paid over three or more taxable years.
- A Statement of Intent is not binding and may be changed or cancelled should the need arise.
- Gifts are tax-deductible as allowed by law.
- Gifts of appreciated securities are welcome and may provide you with additional savings.

Building \$900,000

Lobby Portraits (2)

\$100,000 EACH

Visitors enter the facility through the main entrance and pass through the lobby. This area serves as an educational and informational welcome to the various ICHS departments that are located within the facility. It is directly connected to the cat colony room, cat adoption room, puppy play room, and adoption/get acquainted rooms. Five very passionate sponsors will have their photographic portraits prominently displayed in this lobby.

Adopters/Pets Get Acquainted Room I - Taken Adopters/Pets Get Acquainted Room II - Taken

\$20,000

These quiet rooms allow the prospective adopter to become acquainted with the pet of their choice. This quiet space allows the opportunity to spend quality time with your future pet. It will also provide the space to better know the pet's personality without any interruption.

Puppy/Small Dog Play Room

\$25,000

The four kennels contained in this happy room allow ample space for small dogs and puppies. Since puppies cannot be taken outside until a certain age, their cages can be opened to allow play with visitors and prospective adopters.

Cat Adoption \$75,000

Cats may not find a mint on their pillows at bedtime, but their care and amenities is four star. Spacious cages with individual air returns for optimal health, piped in music, and plenty of socialization and the attention of all our staff, volunteers and visitors make this a special area as cats and kittens wait to become part of loving, adoptive homes.



Cat Play Colony \$60,000

These fortunate felines are all spayed or neutered and have received their vaccinations. They have been selected because they are well socialized. This room has ample light from windows and contains a variety of toys, and climbing and exercise apparatus. Visitors and prospective owners can play with these liberated felines.

Dog Town I - Taken Dog Town II - Taken \$175,000

\$175,000

Dog Town is where all the action is for adoptable dogs (no cats allowed). These two communities contain 39 spacious double kennels. The backs of these kennels face garage doors which when opened in inclement weather, allow the dogs fresh air and natural light. These garage doors connect to four large outside, fenced play areas. Dog Town I contains four birthing kennels, two kennels for very large dogs, and thirteen normal sized kennels. Dog Town II contains 20 normal sized kennels.

Relinquishment Lobby

\$25,000

Our help is on the way for all stray, abused and unwanted canines and felines. In this quiet, private area all relinquished pets receive immediate special attention from our kennel manager, kennel attendants, and volunteers. Our doors and our arms are wide open. No pet ever suffers for lack of a temporary home. This area conveniently connects to special observation rooms where pets are observed and checked thoroughly before introducing them into the main areas of our facility. The relinquishment lobby is accessed by its own outside door in the front corner of the building.

Cat Observation \$25,000

This room contains 18 accommodations for cats that have just been accepted into our facility through the relinquishment lobby. Here these cats will be observed for several days to make sure that they are healthy. Our kennel manager who is a vet technician, in coordination with our visiting veterinarian, makes sure all is "purrefect" before placing them in our cat adoption room.

Cat Quarantine \$15,000

For those newly admitted cats who need a little help and rest, our staff and visiting veterinarian will make sure these cats are on the road to recovery. This room contains 9 accommodations, each with its own air return to eliminate the spread of air born germs.

Dog Observation

\$50,000

This very special room of ten kennels is divided into two areas by a floor to ceiling wall. The first area with seven kennels serves dogs that have just entered our shelter. From the relinquishment lobby they are placed here for several days to make sure they are healthy,



friendly, and socialized. Once they pass their tests, they graduate to Dog Town and then on to a loving, happy home. Those dogs that are not well will be isolated in one of three separate kennels where they will receive special care to place them on the road to recovery. Our staff and visiting veterinarian will give them the loving care and attention they desperately need.

Dog Quarantine \$15,000

For those newly admitted dogs who need a little help and rest, our staff and visiting veterinarian will make sure these dogs are on the road to recovery. This room contains ten accommodations, each with its own air return to eliminate the spread of air born germs.

Spay/Neuter Clinic

\$50,000

No pet leaves our shelter without either being scheduled for or receiving spay/neuter surgery. Our visiting veterinarian will come every Thursday to our clinic to perform this service. Pets are brought in through the relinquishment lobby to this special, sterile room which is a fully equipped surgical suite. The veterinarian and his technicians perform the spay/neuter surgery and discharge the pet the same day. Emergency surgery for injured, new arrivals is also performed here. In many cases these emergency surgeries are life saving to our special pets.

Dog Play Town I II III IV - All Taken

\$75,000 EACH

Located on the outside of Dog Town I and II these special fenced play areas provide ample opportunity for our canines to exercise, play and interact outside. These four areas are accessed through the garage doors.

Fenced Sally Port

\$15,000

Indiana County's Dog Warden as well as our Humane Office can now bring those unlicensed, abandoned, and abused pets into a rear fenced area with a special entrance into our relinquishment lobby. Pets are often so scared when they are brought to our shelter in a strange vehicle by our Warden and Officer, some of them may not be socialized. This special fenced enclosure allows our staff to safely secure and care for these desperate pets.

State Kennels (2)

\$5,000 EACH

Emergencies happen at all times of the day, and our Humane Officer and the Dog Warden promptly answer those calls. Lost, abandoned, and stray pets have a home here even after hours in one of two kennels located in our fenced Sally Port. These kennels are sheltered from the elements and have containers for food and water. The next day, our staff immediately tends to these poor pets' needs.



Meeting/Training/Community Room

\$75,000

Whether it is a club, a class, an organization, or a small group, the community can meet in this bright room and around its large conference table, witness and learn proper care, training, and humane treatment for their pets. This educational area can provide firsthand experience of the many facets and care that go into creating a happy and healthy home for pets, and they can observe and learn the workings of our new facility. Small birthday parties for children, where they can interact with our pets, can be arranged.

Food Preparation Area

\$25,000

This centrally located room contains all feeding supplies for both our cats and dogs. There is ample storage for food, treats, bowls and whatever it takes to feed Fido and Felix, and keep them happy and healthy. Counters, cabinets, shelving and a sink allow staff the space to prepare all the food it takes to feed 60+ dogs and 90+ cats.

Pamper and Laundry Area

\$25,000

A great deal of loving care, a warm bath, grooming in that new style, and a manicure can make any dog or cat feel fabulously adoptable. In order to sleep comfy and cozy at night, a freshly laundered blanket and towel comes straight from this beauty boutique.

Cleaning Room

\$10,000

Cleaning an entire shelter can be quite the challenge, but our dedicated staff will rise to that chore because this room will house state-of-the-art cleaning supplies to keep our shelter both clean and sterile.

Storage Closet

\$10,000

Staff Break Room

\$25,000

The most dedicated and ambitious staffer needs a break occasionally after a rigorous morning of cleaning and feeding our feline and canine residents. This quiet room allows staff to collect and prepare themselves for the afternoon challenges.

Staff Restroom

\$15,000

Caring for so many pets can be a dirty job, and accidents can happen as all pet owners know and understand. This bath will save the day for that staffer who has experienced more than his daily share of clean-up.

Humane Officer/Kennel Manager Officer

\$25,000

Careful records are kept for every rescue, adoption, and foster. Both the Humane Officer and Kennel Manager must maintain records of their services to the county as well as the



daily workings of the shelter. These records account for all the loving care, and attention that has been focused on our pets in order to get them ready for their permanent, loving homes.

Executive Director's Office

\$20,000

Grant writing, community outreach, general organization and the flexibility to be "Johnny on the spot" characterizes the position of the Executive Director; this is her special place to ensure that this facility works smoothly.

Public Restroom

\$10,000

The entrance to the public bathroom is located in the lobby.
